Introduction

Since 1985, Children's Health Scotland, formerly known as Action for Sick Children Scotland, has carried out surveys every few years of hospitals in Scotland that admit children and young people in order to monitor the availability of parental access and family facilities. The findings have been extremely useful for healthcare planners and providers at all levels within Scotland's NHS.

This 2018 survey will capture information on parental access and family facilities within all NHS hospitals in Scotland. The results of the survey, which is funded and supported by the Scottish Government, will be placed in the public domain and will inform the Scottish Government's policy making in relation to the healthcare of children and young people in Scotland. We are grateful for your co-operation in providing information on services for children and young people.

In return, we will supply your Health Board with data showing how your ward or unit compares against the Scottish average for each question in the Survey and provide examples of best practice. All data will be anonymised before being shared or published so that no individual or ward can be identified. Scottish Government Guidance on education for children and young people unable to attend school due to ill health (2015) notes that where a CYP's illness is known or reasonably thought to be likely to extend beyond 5 days, then education should proceed immediately, if medical assessment permits. This is of particular importance for CYP who require recurrent admission to hospital, even for relatively short periods Where there is less certainty over the possible length of any absence, education outwith school should commence at the earliest opportunity and certainly no more than 15 working days of continuous or 20 working days of intermittent absence.
